She is an elected fellow of American Statistical Association (ASA), Institute of Mathematical Statistics, and International Statistical Institute. Dr. Lin is the former Chair of the COPSS (2010-2012) and a former member of the Committee of Applied and Theoretical Statistics (CATS) of the National Academy of Science. She co-launched the new Section of Statistical Genetics and Genomics of the American Statistical Association and served as a former section chair. She is the former Coordinating Editor of Biometrics and the founding co-editor of Statistics in Biosciences.

Dr. Lin's research interests lie in development and application of statistical and computational methods for analysis of massive data from genome, exposome and phenome, and scalable statistical inference and learning for big genomic, epidemiological and health data. Her statistical methodological research has been supported by the MERIT Award (R37) and the Outstanding Investigator Award (OIA) (R35) from the National Cancer Institute (NCI).
